CONTEXT

The University of Lincoln is one of the most dynamic young universities in the country. Situated in the centre of a beautiful cathedral city, our core mission is to combine outstanding, high-impact research and professional practice with a superb student experience and the highest quality civic engagement. Our academics and students engage collaboratively and creatively with some of the key issues of the age, generating insights and creative outputs that push the boundaries of knowledge and practice. Connecting the local to the global, we inspire and support our students to become flexible, self-directed, empathetic citizens of the world, who are prepared for working life today and for what it might become.

In 2020, the University of Lincoln was named Modern University of the Year in The Times and Sunday Times, Good University Guide 2021, as the highest-ranked multi-faculty modern university in the UK, climbing to 45th (out of 135). In the same year it was named one of the world's greatest young universities in the Times Higher Education Young University Rankings. The University has been awarded gold in the Teaching Excellence Framework for its consistently outstanding teaching, learning and outcomes for its students.

Lincoln School of Design has forged a reputation built on teaching excellence, strong relationships with the creative industries, outstanding facilities, and innovative research, scholarship and professional practice activities. It is one of the University of Lincoln's largest schools with over 1,000 design students taught at Arts Foundation, undergraduate and postgraduate levels in Lincoln and Hong Kong. Our impressive specialist studios, labs and workshops, provide spaces in which students can critically appraise the world of design, and share their ideas through practice-based learning. Through opportunities to engage in real academic research and external professional projects, we equip students with the skills, knowledge and experience required for a successful career in a competitive marketplace. Each year, our students win an impressive number of international design awards such as the RSA Student Design Awards and D&AD New Blood Awards. Colleagues in the Lincoln School of Design engage in diverse professional practice - including book art, surf culture, printmaking and visual anthropology- wide-ranging outreach, and exciting business enterprise projects. They also carry out research into a broad range of subjects, often involving collaborations with non-academic partners.

The Interior Architecture and Design programmes are the growth areas in the Lincoln School of Design's portfolio. From September 2021, the Lincoln School of Design will be offering a new BA Interior Architecture Design (IAD) 'top up' degree with Hong Kong Design Institute, which builds on the success of a similar programme in Design, Exhibitions, Events & Performance. The students enrolled on this programme will be based in Hong Kong, and have successfully

completed a relevant Higher Diploma programme at the HKDI. Those that complete the year will be awarded a University of Lincoln degree. We are seeking to appoint a Link Tutor who will develop the curriculum and deliver the teaching for these students in collaboration with HKDI academics. They will also be expected to engage in scholarly activity and/or professional practice, as detailed in the job description.

JOB PURPOSE

General

- To work with colleagues on curriculum development and the advancement of relevant discipline areas within the University.
- To plan, design and deliver teaching within programmes in relevant discipline area.
- To undertake student tutoring and support.
- To conduct individual scholarly and / or professional practice-based projects that contribute to the profile of the School.
- To carry out other activities in support of the academic work of the school particularly in relation to discipline and teaching scholarship and/or relevant professional practice with relevant organisations.

Specific to this post upon appointment:

The successful candidate will act as 'Link Tutor' on the new BA Interior Architecture Design (IAD) 'top up' degree with HKDI. They will work with HKDI and University of Lincoln Interior Architecture and Design colleagues to design and plan the curriculum. They will teach the students online and in person (involving visits to Hong Kong at least three time a year, subject to risk assessment), and provide academic and pastoral support.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

The responsibilities of a Senior Lecturer are wide ranging and may change over time according to the development needs of the department and the individual. In general a Senior Lecturer can expect to undertake any of the following:

Teaching and Learning Support

- To engage in teaching on undergraduate and/or postgraduate level programmes as determined by the Head of School. The range of teaching duties may change from time to time.
- Take responsibility for the design, content and delivery of specific areas of teaching and learning and for the quality of teaching delivered.
- Ensure that teaching content is appropriately informed by current research and advanced scholarly activity.
- Collaborate with colleagues in the continuous review and development of the Department's programmes.
- Work in accordance with University policies and procedures to undertake assessment of students' work and give feedback.

Scholarly Activity and Professional Practice

- Conduct individual and / or collaborative scholarly and / or professional practice projects.
- Identify sources of funding and contribute to the projects of securing funds for own scholarly activities, where appropriate.
- Extend, transform and apply knowledge acquired from scholarship and professional practice to teaching and appropriate external activities.
- Work with Professional bodies or relevant industry contacts to develop student or educational contract opportunities for the School.
- Work with colleagues in the School to develop relevant activities to enhance the income and reputation of the School and University.
- Develop relevant bids and tenders to enhance programmes and modules for organisations.
- Develop consultancy activities with partners in relevant organisations.
- Engage in subject professional and pedagogy research as required to support teaching activities and contribute towards the priorities of the School and / or College.
- Ensure that outcomes of scholarly activity and/or professional practice are appropriately disseminated in peer reviewed outlets.
- Supervise and manage projects, if required.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Scope and dimensions of the role

The primary purpose of this role is to teach the Interior Architecture and Design (IAD) Year 3 'top up' programme to students based in Hong Kong. It is anticipated the Senior Lecturer 'HKDI Link Tutor' post will spend between five to ten days three times a year in Hong Kong to deliver in person teaching and assessment, as well as attend required academic meetings and other appropriate duties. Teaching delivered from the UK will involve a flexible working pattern due to the time zone difference. Generally, this will involve an agreed number of early morning starts to teaching, which will end in the early afternoon. The post holder will be required to maintain their currency in relation to their specialism, and engage in activities aimed at enhancing student recruitment and employability.
