#### CONTEXT

The University of Lincoln is working towards an exciting project towards generating nitrogen datasets for LINCAM CERES enterprise collaboration. The project seeks to find ways to improve nitrogen use efficiency without loss of yield in contrasting environments across the country. The research objective is to generate datasets for winter wheat to predict optimal nitrogen requirement based on local environmental conditions and growth stage.

The key role of the post is to collect crop data and processing of samples on several trials across the country. The research assistant will liaise with PDRAs of the project and should be motivated to assist the field sampling campaign of the project. You will be expected to have experience in field trials collecting samples from crops but ideally wheat. Experience in handling and analysing crop samples is essential (preferably wheat). Familiarity with field data collection is desirable.

## **JOB PURPOSE**

The Research Assistant will work in a team and assist with data collection for conducting research on the project, as directed by the Principal Investigator. S/he is not expected to operate as an independent researcher.

## **KEY RESPONSIBILITIES**

## **Literature Surveys**

To undertake literature surveys and other investigations of the state-of-the-art and to prepare reports as required.

#### Research

To perform specified research under the direction and with advice from the Principal Investigator, to generate original knowledge, contribute to decisions about research direction, and to prepare reports on results, as required. The research assistant will not be expected to act as an independent researcher.

Plan own day-to-day research activity within the context of the required research programme, exhibiting a high degree of autonomy.

Contribute to the production of research outputs, including software, reports, papers and other publications, and preparation for and presentation at international research conferences.

## Liaison and Networking

Liaise with internal and external collaborators, and with colleagues in the Department, maintaining positive and effective working relationships; this may include liaison with senior personnel in other organisations including collaborators, sponsors and clients.

Participate in internal research activities, including seminars, research meetings and continuous professional development activities.

## **Teaching Support**

If required, engage in teaching support activities, up to a maximum of six hours per week.

#### **PhD**

Where appropriate and agreed, register for and undertake a PhD or other specified research degree.
