CONTEXT

The post-holder will be working full-time on a Wellcome Discovery Award funded project entitled '*Discovering Liveability: Coproducing alternatives to suicide prevention*'. Discovering Liveability is a 7-year collaborative research project, led by an interdisciplinary team of academics, practitioners and people with lived/living experiences of suicide who are based at the University of Lincoln, University of Edinburgh and Mind in Camden. The project aims to conduct a wide-ranging, qualitatively driven, and co-produced inquiry into the possibilities of 'liveability' as a focus for suicide prevention; establish, grow and critically evaluate approaches centring lived and living experiences of suicide; and interrogate the role of politics and policies in shaping the possibilities for 'liveability'.

JOB PURPOSE

The Research Assistant is responsible for conducting research on the project, as directed by their Line Manager, Principal Investigator(s) and relevant Co-Investigators.

The Research Assistant will join Work Package 2 of the '*Discovering Liveability: Coproducing alternatives to suicide prevention*' project. In addition to the salary, the Research Assistant role also comes with tuition fees for the successful applicant to undertake a part-time MPhil/PhD (Doctoral Degree) in Social Science within the School of Social and Political Sciences, University of Lincoln. The project will fund PhD tuition fees (home fees).

As part of Work Package 2, this role specifically focuses on community-based support for racialised/marginalised communities who experience suicidality/suicide/suicidal ideation. We are seeking candidates with experience working with these communities, and particularly welcome applicants with their own lived experiences of racialisation, marginalisation, and/or suicidality.

Work Package 2 (co-led by Alex Oaten, University of Lincoln and Sarah Huque, University of Edinburgh) focuses on community-based practices of care for suicidality. The postholder will be expected to conduct a participatory ethnographic study with an organisation/organisations that support a racialised/marginalised community or communities experiencing suicidality, in an urban area of England. The postholder will be involved in data analysis from the ethnographic study and will contribute to relevant outputs linked to Work Package 2 research.

You do NOT need to have a postgraduate degree to apply for this position, though applicants with these credentials are welcome to apply.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Literature Surveys

To undertake literature surveys and other investigations of the state-of-the-art and to prepare reports as required.

Research

To perform specified research under the direction and with advice from the Line Manager, Principal Investigator(s) and relevant Co-Investigators, to generate original knowledge, contribute to decisions about research direction, and to prepare reports on results, as required. The research assistant will not be expected to act as an independent researcher.

Plan own day-to-day research activity within the context of the required research programme, exhibiting a high degree of autonomy.

Contribute to the production of research outputs, including software, reports, papers and other publications, and preparation for and presentation at international research conferences.

Liaison and Networking

Liaise with internal and external collaborators, and with colleagues in the Department, maintaining positive and effective working relationships; this may include liaison with senior personnel in other organisations including collaborators, sponsors and clients.

Participate in internal research activities, including seminars, research meetings and continuous professional development activities.

PhD

Where appropriate and agreed, register for and undertake a PhD or other specified research degree.

In addition to the above, undertake such duties as may reasonably be requested and that are commensurate with the nature and grade of the post.
