CONTEXT

The Lincoln Institute for Rural and Coastal Health (LIRCH) is the country's first integrated and multidisciplinary research institute dedicated to rural and coastal health research. LIRCH has been awarded £10.9 million funding from Research England's Expanding Excellence in England (E3) fund and is in the process of significant expansion. As part of this expansion, the University will recruit to over twenty research positions. A technical and professional services team will also be embedded within the Institute to support the research and develop a financially sustainable research Institute.

With this expanded capacity, the Institute will bring together multiple disciplines to produce impactful research helping to tackle the place-based inequalities experienced by rural, coastal, and remote communities. By co-designing and shaping the emerging discipline together with the next generation of researchers and affected communities, LIRCH aims to create the future academic and community leaders of rural and coastal health.

The postholder will contribute to shaping the collective research portfolio of LIRCH and is expected to have displayed a keen interest in understanding spatial and structural determinants of health, health outcome disparities faced by communities, and mixed-method approaches throughout their academic career to date.

JOB PURPOSE

The Post Doctoral Research Associate is responsible for conducting research on projects within the LIRCH portfolio, as directed by the Principal Investigator, and is expected to operate with a significant degree of autonomy. They are not expected to operate as an independent researcher. The post holder may be required to help supervise the work of more junior researchers.

The appointed PDRA will contribute to the acquisition of external funding, helping to supervise PhD students, publishing in the highest quality journals and conferences, contributing to positive impacts on rural, remote and coastal communities, and conducting research in line with the targets set by LIRCH and the University of Lincoln.

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KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Literature and Evidence Synthesis

Conduct comprehensive reviews including literature, scoping, rapid evidence and systematic reviews across a range of themes relevant to the Institute, and prepare reports as required.

Programme of Research

Undertake a programme of interdisciplinary research under the direction of the Principal Investigator, demonstrating a significant level of autonomy.

Lead in the production of high-quality research outputs, including reports, papers and other publications of national/international standing.

Project Management

Perform project management activities, planning, scheduling, monitoring and reporting on progress of research projects.

Contribute to the production of annual reports and any other reporting requirements, as appropriate.

Liaison and Networking

Engage with external stakeholders and collaborators including local authorities, NHS partners, community organisations, and national bodies, together with colleagues in the Institute, at all times maintaining positive and effective working relationships.

Establish an awareness of and engagement with stakeholder networks that are relevant to rural and coastal health as well as to the future evolution and success of the Institute.

Internal Research Activities

Participate in and help to organise internal research activities, including seminars, research meetings and conferences. Support interdisciplinary research development within LIRCH.

Continuous Professional Development

Undertake continuous professional development activities.

Grant Applications

Contribute to the production of grant applications.

Ensure impact plans are embedded in grant applications.

Teaching Support

Assist in the supervision of postgraduate research students.

In addition to the above, undertake such duties as may reasonably be requested and that are commensurate with the nature and grade of the post.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Scope and dimensions of the role

This is primarily a research-focussed role within the rapidly growing Lincoln Institute of Rural and Coastal Health. The postholder will be required to co-develop and conduct innovative studies using both quantitative and qualitative methods, including GIS, simulation modelling and community-engaged research. Working closely with external stakeholders, including local authorities, health and care providers, government bodies and community groups, the postholder will help to support the Institute's ambition for impactful, interdisciplinary research and sustainable community transformation.

The postholder is required to work collectively within and beyond the Institute as well as with community partners. They are expected to actively support efforts to co-create knowledge and strengthen research impact to ensure positive impacts for rural, remote and coastal communities, and contribute to achieving the objectives aligned to securing financial sustainability for the Institute.
